Documentation File Check List

APPLICANT REQUIREMENTS

- Provide the results of a criminal record check
- Sign a declaration stating whether the applicant is currently under investigation for unprofessional conduct or has been disciplined in the past by the College or by another regulatory body. This is on the second page of the application form.
- Labour Market Opinion (LMO) - if a temporary foreign worker. This ensures all workers in Alberta, including foreign workers; are protected by the relevant labour and employment laws, are entitled to work in a safe workplace where their health is protected and will be paid the wages to which the worker is entitled.

After Application is received at the College of Dental Technologists of Alberta

- Completion of a Public Health and Safety Practical Exam "RDT", or Prior Learning Assessment Recognition (PLAR) to be administered in Korea, the United States or England. The PLAR is a four-part technical assessment consisting of: cast partials, dentures, crowns, bridges and orthodontics.
- Internationally trained professionals must complete a 6 week "Bridging Program for Foreign Health Care Professionals" in Alberta.

Upon successful completion of a Public Health and Safety Practical Exam "RDT", or Prior Learning Assessment Recognition (PLAR) and the Bridging Program for Professionals, an applicant must submit the annual registration fee, prepay and complete the following within one year:

- A two-day Infection Control Workshop (Asepsis). Infection Control is a Provincial Alberta Health initiative for all 28 Health Care Professionals. It is programming that protects the Public with regard to Health Care Professionals delivery to the Alberta Public.
- A one-day workshop on the Dental Technologist Profession Legislative Standards of Practice and Codes of Ethics.
- A First Aid / Level "C" CPR course, or equivalent. If choosing an equivalent, a course outline must be provided before the class is taken. Please provide a copy of certificate with expiry date.
